
How can a Brown Bag Medication Checkup help you?




 An adverse drug event is an injury resulting from the use of a drug, such as an allergic reaction or overdose.



• Do you know the effects of your prescribed and over-the-counter medications?



- Each year, four in 1,000 Americans visit an Emergency Department due to adverse drug events.
- One in four of these visits result in hospitalization.



• For older Americans, the rate is even higher, with nearly half of the visits resulting in hospitalization.




• The good news is, most adverse drug events are preventable.

- If you take medicines for
 - High blood pressure
 - Heart failure
 - Angina or heart disease
 - Asthma
 - COPD
 - Diabetes
 - Chronic pain

- After you schedule your appointment, follow these three simple steps:
 - 1. Grab a bag



- 2. Fill your bag with all new and old medications. This includes...
 - Prescriptions, over-the-counter drugs, vitamins, supplements, pill organizers, pill bottles, puffers and devices, patches and sprays, medicated creams and ointments, eye and ear drops



• 3. Bring the bag to your appointment with a health care professional.



- Your health care provider will do the following:
 - Review your medicines
 - Discuss why you take each medicine
 - Demonstrate how to take each medicine
 - Ensure you are taking medicines correctly
 - Explain how to dispose of unneeded medicines
 - Prepare an updated medicine list that you can share with other health care professionals
